

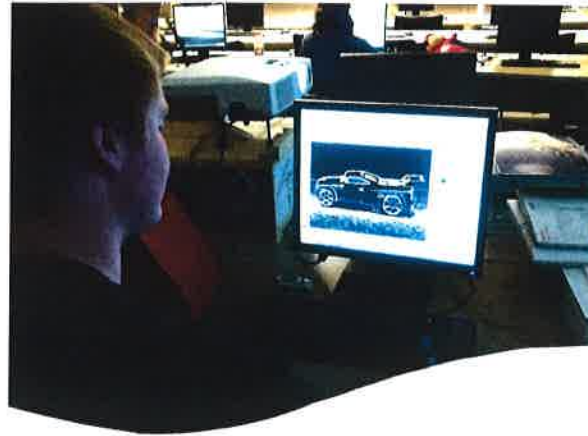

Moreover, we have contracted through the Pierce County Skills Center to offer satellite courses at White River High School in several Career and Technical Education courses. Who is summer school for?

Everybody! With the new 24 credit diploma it is imperative students build credits to ensure graduation. From students who need to retrieve credits in core academic areas to those who just want to try something new and learn about digital photography, there is something for everyone. What Courses will be offered?

Session I: June 26th-July 14th

Cost: Pierce County Skills Center courses are offered at **no cost** to the student.

Digital Photography: Learn how to use dSLR cameras; gain understanding of shutter speed, aperture and ISO; learn about how the Elements of Art and Principle of Design apply to photography; gain working knowledge of Photoshop for photo editing.

Applied Algebra or Geometry: Develop mathematical reasoning and communication skills critical to analytical problem-solving, self-management and collaboration skills through a coordinated series of activities and projects.

Environmental Science: Emphasis is placed on the scientific principles, concepts, and methodologies required for understanding the interrelationships of the natural world, to identify and analyze environmental problems both natural and human-made, to evaluate the relative risks associated with these problems, and to examine alternative solutions for resolving and/or preventing them.
