# High School Students Earn College Credit NOW!

YOU can earn Community/Technical College credit at the same time you earn high school credit by completing selected high school courses with a 'B' grade or better\*.

### WHY earn college credit now?

- You save up to \$1,500 in college tuition before you graduate from high school.
- Attend your selected Community/Technical College after high school graduation and you register before other new students.
- You stay on your high school campus and receive college credit.
- University Bound? Check with the admissions office for more information about their policy on credit transfer.
- Military bound? Earn a promotion and a pay raise with your college credits.

### HOW to earn college credit?

- Go to <http://sers.techprepwa.org>
- New students: Click 'Create an Account'; Returning students, log in using your user name and password.
- Click, 'Register for Classes'. To find all classes, select your School District then your High School and click "Go Search". To narrow your search, select teacher then click "Go Search".
- Checkmark the classes you want.
- Click the "Register" button in the top-left navigation menu.
- Checkmark the teacher who is teaching your class.
- When you have made your selections, click, 'Save & Register'.
- Earn a 'B' (3.0) grade or better AND meet all articulation requirements in each of your high school Dual Credit courses.
- College transcripts will be available by October the following school year.
